 - a. Tate: For the first time since I've been President, CIPPs are down. We've talked with the National Office and they agree that it is an issue across the nation. This means that dues revenue is down but we always budget that CIPP dues will be flat. Till now they always outpaced what we projected but this year they were down by about ~\$19k. Part of that was three SWWC teams had left but are now back under the fold, Ft Hood, Ft Sill, Euless, HEB and Lone Star folded. We did have a few new clubs but only brought in a few players. Referee expenses went up even though the number of registered players went down but the addition of Men's D4 and Women's D4 meant more matches. With the budget we were able to make up the difference because the first round of playoffs were in Texas (no travel grants for the first round), Women's All Stars came in under budget etc. We'll see more of that when we dive into the financials in a second.
 - i. Tate: If this trend of CIPP registration and player growth doesn't reverse itself, we're going to have to figure out how we address that. If we carry on like this, our savings account is going to dwindle. We're not in danger of draining the account now but we want to address it now. So we'll need to talk about how grow revenue, cut programs or do we want to raise dues.

b. Financials

- i. CIPP Stats
 - 1. Tate: Roughly 2,200 members in the union, down several hundred players from last year. On the good side, we played 63 MD4 and 10 WD3 matches. This is helping clubs grow and helping more people play more rugby. So we're giving you more values for your dues.
 - a. Watson: With the dues being down, how does the SWWC teams coming back help?
 - b. Tate: Yes, the three SWWC teams have come back and they've brought all of the Lone Star clubs with them. Eight 15s clubs and half a dozen 7s clubs that are now TRU member clubs. A side note, with those clubs coming back into the fold there are no changes to the TRU Board. But the

Board has already been having discussions about making sure all of our members have a voice and a representative. We don't quite know what the makeup is yet but we're discussing it.

ii. Dues

1. Tate: While USA dues may not be going up, note that we are discussing this locally. We've added more rugby and more value but haven't raised the dues.

i. Tate: We were approached by Oz Tag, based out of Australia and expanding in the USA to become a partner with them. They are wanting to setup youth, HS, club and mixed touch teams across the USA. This is a no cost opportunity but another way to bring more rugby players into our area. We are not obligated to spend money, referees or facilities.
